#### The New You | Reading Plan

#### Each day this week, read Colossians 1.1-23

(in addition to the regular BTW exercises).

## Day 1 2 Kings 17.7-23 | Idolatry...A Deep Problem

The children of God are instructed to flee the sin of idolatry. In *Gods at War*, Kyle Idleman points out that in ancient Israel idolatry was one of the only two sins requiring the death penalty. However, Israel allowed this heinous pattern to set in. When they entered foreign lands, God instructed them not to live as those around them. But they rebelled. "They imitated the nations around them although the LORD had ordered them, 'Do not do as they do" (2 Kings 17.15).

This weekend, Jeff Manion talked about sexual sin, and it's worth noting that our sexual impulses can be just as idolatrous as anything. We can easily be controlled by our good and natural (though often out of control) desires.

The thought hits us today. Have we elevated anything (e.g., sex) above God? Have we followed the lead of the culture around us? (Remember, the values of our society are not designed to point you to God.) The sins of the Israelites are graphically listed in 2 Kings 17.7-23. Read this passage and then make a list of your own idols. What is it that God would write about you? Commit this list to the Lord in repentance.

### $Day\ 2\ {\sf James}\ {\sf 1.13-15}\ |\ {\sf Being}\ {\sf Tempted}$

I made a covenant with my eyes not to look lustfully at a young woman (Job 31.1).

Do you ever think you are less mature spiritually because you are tempted on a regular basis? Look at the list of sinful behavior in Colossians 3.5: sexual immorality, impurity, lust. We can often feel condemned simply because we are tempted by these sins. But it's not true. Everyone faces temptation, but not all choose to give in to that temptation. Even Jesus was tempted. In Hebrews 4.15, we read these words: "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin."

There is a big difference between temptation and sin. Being tempted is not sinful; giving in to the temptation is. Today's reading describes how that happens. Spend a few minutes, today, drawing near to God and asking him to help you see when you are tempted and then for strength to avoid the sin. Then, be encouraged by Hebrews 4.16: "Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." Cling to the mercy available through the grace of our Lord by listening to "Grace Flows Down" by Christy Nockels (search youtube.com).

#### Day 3 Proverbs 5 | Giving in to Temptation

Our culture will tell you, "Everyone is doing it. It's okay. It won't hurt you." Idols such as sex, greed, and self-worship permeate our culture. The message is: the goal of life is to be happy, and you are not happy unless you pursue "X." That's when we (or at least our sexual desires) become our own idols.

With idolatry you are never content in the present; you live in the future always wanting something (or someone) more or different or prettier or sexier. You cannot overcome this pull on your own. You need the Spirit of God to rescue and empower you. If you have given in to temptation though, know that you are not alone. The Lord calls you to lean on his mercy. Today, commit to depending on the Lord's mercy and pursuing his glory. If you have fallen, pursue God's forgiveness (1 John 1.9). The heartfelt song, "Grace" by Silars Bald, may give you a simple prayer to pray (search youtube.com).

God has created us for this intimacy in the context of the marriage covenant. Yes, it can become warped, but we shouldn't let movies or media dictate our mental image of sex. Today, consider reading one of the books below under "MORE" to gain a healthy view of sex as God designed it.

# $Day \ 5 \ \text{Psalm 103.1-5} \ | \ \text{Worshiping the Living God}$

Worship is the right response to God, and idolatry is clearly the wrong response. Idolatry is essentially misplaced worship—when we center our lives on something other than God. But, we are created to worship the living God, not some fake imitation. The Psalms are full of words like "worship," praise," and "glorify." We cannot ignore our calling to worship the living God.

Psalm 103 is a beautiful example of a cogent expression of worship. Spend a few minutes reading these lines and responding to God's goodness in your own words. Do you have a hunger to draw nearer to God through worship? At Ada Bible, a growing number of people have expressed this same desire.
