In what ways do you see generosity displayed in our society today?

Have you ever felt overwhelmed by the generosity of God in nature? What was that experience like?

How does viewing everyday blessings (like food) as reflections of God's generosity change your perspective on life?

Have someone read 2 Corinthians 8:9. How does God's generosity in Christ affect your understanding of your worth and value?

Pastor Jeff said that what was done *for* you in Christ is more powerful than whatever was done *to* you. How does this reframe your hard experiences?

In what ways do you find it challenging to be generous with your time, talents or resources?

How can we help each other cultivate the spirit of cheerful giving described in 2 Corinthians 9:7?

Reflect on your own life. In what specific way do you feel God inviting you to join his ongoing conversation of generosity?

What is one step you could take to be generous this week?
