THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Pastor Jeff Manion concludes our series by looking again at the story of Ruth and Paul's letter to Timothy. As a group, name his main points.

Which part of the sermon most encouraged or challenged you, and why?

Providing for one's own family is an example of faith at work. Where have you seen someone live this out well?

When it comes to caring for the needs of others, family is the first line of defense. How can this principle apply to our efforts in caring for others?

Jesus applied the fifth commandment to "Honor your father and your mother" to adult children and their parents (Exodus 20:12). What could it look like to honor your parents in your current season of life?

What is one aspect of honoring your parents that you find challenging?

Paul says caring for the needs of one's parents is pleasing to God (1 Timothy 5:4). If you have an example, share about a time you helped a parent or another family member and how you sensed it pleased God.

One of the overarching points of this sermon series is that the best help we can give others is to encourage their efforts to provide for themselves and others. How can this practice shape how you help others moving forward?
