## SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

#### THIS WEEK'S TEXT

Have someone read **Genesis 16:1-16**.

Who are the main characters in this story, and what are their relationships with each other?

How do they each respond to their circumstances?

How does God respond to the characters in the passage?

#### THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Pastor Jeff Manion talked about our response in seasons of waiting and what we believe about God in those seasons. As a group, name the main points shared in the sermon.

Which part of the sermon most encouraged or challenged you, and why?

Why might people not trust God during a season of waiting?

What are some of your typical feelings or responses when in a season of waiting?

What practices can you implement to build your faith and trust in God during a season of waiting instead of running toward a breaking point?

This week's passage shows how families can be common spaces for breaking points to happen. What family relationships do you most need God's help to love and respond well? Share with your group and commit to praying for each other this week.

When was the last time you felt seen by God, and what did that look like?

Is there anything else from this sermon you wanted to talk about?
