SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

Welcome to our new sermon series <u>REBUILD</u>. This week, we look at Nehemiah's response to distressing news and his prayer to God in Nehemiah 1.

What is some good news you've received recently?

THIS WEEK'S TEXT

Have someone read Nehemiah 1 aloud.

What news does Nehemiah receive in this passage?

What emotions does Nehemiah exhibit?

What actions do you see Nehemiah take in response to this news?

THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Pastor Jeff Manion began our new series called **REBUILD** by looking at the news Nehemiah received and his response found in Nehemiah 1. As a group, name his main points.

Which part of the sermon most encouraged or challenged you, and why?

Nehemiah recognizes that his people's situation in Jerusalem "isn't the way it's supposed to be." What situations do we encounter today that aren't supposed to be this way?

Nehemiah begins his prayer by recognizing God's character. What aspects of God's character have helped you turn to him during breaking points?

Nehemiah owns his part in the problem. Are you more likely to pass the blame and not own your part in a situation, or do you recognize your part and confess it, and why?

Is there a situation where God is calling you to own your part and ask for his forgiveness? If you are comfortable, share with the group and commit to praying for each other this week.

Part of God's character is showing mercy, restoring and welcoming people home. How have you seen this to be true in your life?

Nehemiah asks God to help him be part of the solution. Where might God invite you to be part of the solution, and what do you sense he may desire to do through you?

Is there anything else about the sermon you wanted to talk about?
