SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

Welcome to the third week of our series **MAKE IT REAL**. This week, we look at James's teaching about not showing favoritism.

ICEBREAKER

If you could choose any person from history to be your friend, who would it be and why?

THIS WEEK'S TEXT

Have someone read James 2:1-13 aloud.

What challenges you in this passage?

How does a tendency to favor the rich and powerful contradict core Christian truths according to James?

What motivation does James provide to let go of prejudices and show equal care for all people regardless of background?

THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Pastor Aaron Buer taught that playing favorites goes against the way of Jesus and hinders making our faith real. As a group, recall some of the sermon's big ideas or main points.

What are some criteria people use, consciously or not, to determine someone's worth?

Pastor Aaron discussed how we play favorites because of how someone's "glory" or status could benefit us. In what ways have you seen people attach themselves to someone for their own benefit?

What do we need to remember about Jesus in order to stop comparing ourselves to others or to stop using others for our gain?

James encourages us to view our circumstances through the lens of the gospel. How does the gospel change how you see vulnerable people?

Who do you know that reflects the heart of God and lives out the gospel by not showing favoritism? What have you observed about them and how they live?

Pastor Aaron described favoritism as "me loving me and using you." How does showing favoritism hinder us from obeying the royal law (Matthew 22:37-38)?

What do you risk when you love yourself and use others?

What difference has God's mercy through Jesus made in how you treat other people with regard to favoritism?

What is one thing you can do this week to show God's mercy and love to someone whom you usually avoid or overlook?

Which part of the sermon encouraged or challenged you the most, and why?
