Describe the emotions the two disciples felt while walking along the road. How did this encounter with Jesus change their perspective?

What does this passage reveal about Jesus and what he is like?

## **THIS WEEK'S SERMON**

Pastor Aaron Buer taught about Jesus's resurrection and the impact it should make on our lives. As a group, recall some of the sermon's big ideas or main points.

Where or what do people tend to turn to when feeling disillusioned or having lost hope?

Has there been a time when you misunderstood who Jesus is or put your hope in the wrong thing regarding him? If so, what did that look like?

How has Jesus challenged your misconceptions about him and what it means to follow him?

Have there been times in your life, past or present, when you wanted Jesus as your Savior but not as Lord over your life? What were those times?

What could it look like practically to allow Jesus to be Savior and Lord over every area of your life?

When have you sensed Jesus opening your eyes to understanding him or the Scriptures in a new way?

How can we, as a group, support each other in keeping our hope rightly placed in the risen Jesus?

Which part of the sermon encouraged or challenged you the most, and why?
