THIS WEEK'S TEXT

Have someone read 1 John 3:1-10 aloud.

What phrases or words stand out to you from the passage?

How does John describe God's love towards us?

According to verses 3-10, how should our identity as God's children affect the way we live?

THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Pastor Aaron concluded the **CONFIDENT** series by discussing our identity as God's children. As a group, recall some of the sermon's big ideas and main points.

As believers, what is most true about us is that we are children of God. But if we're honest, we often find ourselves anchoring our identity in other things instead. What do we often look to for a sense of identity and worth?

How would your life be different if you truly lived out of your identity as a loved child of God?

The apostle John uses breathtaking language to describe the love God has for us. It is a love that causes wonder. It is unconditional and self-sacrificial, seeking the highest good for us. What feelings and thoughts come to mind when you hear this?

Pastor Aaron discussed our future transformation—that we will be like Jesus in character and body (1 John 3:2). How does having this hope influence the way we handle current struggles and suffering?

As God's children, we are "co-heirs with Christ" (Romans 8:17) who will help God restore creation. How does this future calling give meaning to the work we do today?

We don't purify ourselves to become God's children, but because we already are his children. What is the difference between these two motivations, and why does it matter?

All who hope in Jesus purify themselves, just as he is pure. How can we encourage and hold one another accountable in our pursuit of righteous living?
