### **SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE**

Welcome to another week of our sermon series, **EPIC**. This week, we explore the story of Joshua and how to navigate life's unexpected turning points.

#### **ICEBREAKER**

Share about a significant turning point in your life (going to college, getting married, a new job, becoming a parent, etc.) What made that season feel so different from everything before it?

#### THIS WEEK'S TEXT

Have someone read Joshua 3:1-5 aloud.

Why does God command the people to follow the ark of the covenant? What does the ark represent?

What does this passage reveal about God's character?

Why does Joshua tell the people to consecrate themselves?

#### THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Pastor Aaron Buer continued our series by exploring how Joshua led Israel through a pivotal turning point. As a group, recall some of the sermon's big ideas and main points.

How does our culture tend to approach major life transitions? What do people tend to rely on during these moments?

If God is leading and you are following, it's impossible to go wrong. What does this mean, and why is it important to remember?

God's command to Israel to remain at a distance from the ark is all about honor. Why is it important for us to follow God on his terms, rather than our own?

In your life, is God's word just advice or is it authority? What's the difference, and why does it matter?

How does living in a state of spiritual preparation help us navigate the unexpected?

Preparing spiritually involves building rhythms and habits that strengthen our relationship with God. What is one habit you can put into practice this week to help your own spiritual readiness?

Remembering God's work in the past fuels our faithfulness in the present. What is one way you've experienced God's faithfulness that fuels your faith today?

#### **WRAP UP**

Like Israel, we are called to be prepared to follow God through life's turning points. This is something that cannot be done alone. As we wrap up, how can we support one another in life's current turning points?
